Why École McTavish?

Academics:

In the last three years, nearly 50% of our students (that's over 400 students) are on the honour roll. We know how to program for honours students in both junior and senior high.

Our Grade 9 students do very well on the Provincial Achievement Test compared to the Province and are often one of the top results for the city for that grade.

Safe and Welcoming Environment:

98% of parents and 84% of students feel that the school has a safe and orderly environment.

96% of parents felt their child's teacher cared about their child.

Homeroom classes group students together for core courses.

98% of parents said they feel welcomed when they visit the school and 93% indicated that their child enjoys attending the school.



Performing Arts:

Our amazing theatre seats over 240 people and has a state of the art rear-projection screen, sound system, and lighting system. We have put on such plays/productions as Into the Woods, Matilda, The Wiz, Beauty and the Beast, Seussical Jr., Annie Jr., Aladdin Jr. and a Broadway Showcase!


The Band program travels to Edmonton each year, and every other year the senior band travels internationally. Past trips have included New York City, Ottawa, Montreal, and Disneyland!

Junior High

Grade 7:

Welcome to our McTavish Family! We are genuinely excited to have you here. Students in grade 7 English programming take six required subjects: English Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, Health and Physical Education. The other two courses are electives of their choice! French Immersion students also take French Language Arts, so that leaves them with one elective to take each term. Refer to the pages on Electives.

Grade 8:

Not the youngest at the school anymore! It's time to start thinking about your passions and future goals. Students in grade 8 English programming take six required subjects: English Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, Health and Physical Education. The other two courses are electives of their choice. You are encouraged to try some new things! French Immersion students also take French Language Arts, so that leaves them with one elective to take each term. Refer to the pages on Electives.



Grade 9:

You did it! The last year of Junior High! It's time to start considering your path for high school. Please refer to our Course Handbook and review the Guidelines for academics. Students in grade 9 English programming take six required subjects: English Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, Health and Physical Education. The other two courses are electives of their choice. You are encouraged to try some new things! French Immersion students also take French Language Arts, so that leaves them with one elective to take each term. Refer to the pages on Electives.

Electives:

Junior High Students will get up to 8 different electives over the course of a year in regular programming. We are developing new electives all the time, with input from both staff and students.

BAND: This course introduces the students to the world of instrumental music. Students may begin the year on flute, clarinet, alto/tenor saxophone, trumpet, French horn, euphonium trombone, or tuba, with auditions for oboe, bass clarinet, baritone saxophone, and percussion occurring in late December. Students will learn to play their instruments, read musical notation and develop their aural skills. Different styles of music will be explored and performances in a variety of band settings will be available.

FRENCH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE: This course concentrates on a basic understanding of the French language. Students learn basic grammar as well as specific vocabulary themes throughout the year. Listening comprehension, speaking, reading and writing are stressed as well.

ART: The goal for this course is to make you a better artist. Whether you are an advanced student or a complete beginner, every artist can learn something new!

SPORTS PERFORMANCE: The aim of Sports Performance is to provide students more time to work on their personal fitness and skill with regards to different sports. Both team and individual games will be played as well as working on their fitness through a variety of different workouts. Students who enjoy Physical Education will love Recreation Fitness.

DRAMA: This class encompasses many of the facets of dramatic art: movement, voice, improvisation and so on. The overall goal of drama is to foster an awareness of yourself – physically, emotionally, socially, creatively, and spiritually.

FASHION STUDIES: Knowledge of Sewing Machine technology and fabric preparation will be applied to hand and machine-sewn projects.

WOODSHOP: This course begins with a strong safety emphasis and with a tool recognition unit. The students will learn how to use hand tools and four of the power tools (scroll saw, band saw, drill press and sander).

MEDICAL SCIENCE: Students will complete modules about health services, body systems including digestive and cardiovascular and a module on infection and immunity. This course is intended for students who are interested in the health service or medical field.

COSMETOLOGY: Students taking this course will get basic knowledge in giving manicures, pedicures, braiding hair and coloring/cutting hair. Also aspects of skin care, facial treatments, cosmetic make-up services, and hair removal are covered.

PHOTOGRAPHY: This course provides a series of experiences using advanced equipment, camera techniques, as well as mounting and presentation techniques.

ROBOTICS: Students will build LEGO robots and have their robots compete with their classmates' robots. Programming and building skills will be developed.

MYTHBUSTING SCIENCE: What do alien abductions, ghost hunting, philosophy, history, water witching and phone book friction have in common? Science of course! Myth-busting Science makes the normal every day, and not so normal, scientific. Come and discover what Myth-busting Science is, what it can be, and what it can offer your school and your students.

COMPUTER SCIENCE/STEM: This option works through the Scientific Method and the Engineering Design Process to solve problems and create prototypes for given situations and scenarios. Depending on the problem presented this can be done through computer animated design, 3D printing or construction of 3D prototypes.

DANCE/CHEER: In this option, students are introduced to various types of dance. They learn barre technique and various steps, as well as apply their learning through choreography. In cheerleading, they will be introduced to motions, basic stunting techniques and how to perform them safely.

GLEE: Glee is offered in Grades 7-9 for students who love to sing! There is lots of flexibility for students to sing in groups with one another, or challenge themselves to sing alone. There are weekly in-class performances, as well as public performance opportunities such as Open Mic Nights, concerts, assemblies, and performances in the community. Students can stay in Glee for more than one term in the school year if they wish!

IMPROV: Improvisation is a fun and effective way for students to learn how to listen, interpret body language cues, take stress and 'butterflies' and turn it into excitement, and learn how to be flexible when the unexpected happens. You do not need to be an actor to take this class. Just be ready to say 'Yes' and have some fun!

NEWSCASTING: In Newscasting, students learn to produce, film, and edit the morning announcements. They also come up with different segments that include such things as weather reports, public service announcements, favorite teacher shoutouts, learning new words from different languages, and jokes of the day.

YOGA: Come learn yoga in an accepting and relaxed environment. This class is suitable for students at all levels and is geared towards improving the self rather than competing with others. We start with the basics and then explore a variety of styles of yoga like: flow, deep stretching, partner yoga, and restorative yoga. You'll learn techniques that will help you achieve calm, improve your sleep, and gain strength and flexibility. Mats, cushions, and all other props are provided, just bring your positive attitude!

OUTDOOR EDUCATION: This course gives students the opportunity to learn about the great outdoors. Whether finding a route with a map and compass, exploring the trails around the school or trying to do some bicycle maintenance to keep your wheels turning, students will be given many opportunities to be active outside the classroom!

FITNESS: Students are given the opportunity to be physically active both inside and outside the school. Each class begins with a stretching routine followed by exercises to get your body moving. Weight training as well as various sports are some common themes for this class. No pain, no gain is the motto!

GUITAR: Students of all abilities are invited to join Guitar class! We have plenty of guitars for students to use during class time, or you are welcome to bring your own! Students will learn strumming patterns and chords, and are free to learn their favourite songs and work in their preferred genre of music.

Other Electives that have been offered include: Mindfulness, Film Studies, Songwriting, Strategic Gaming, Music Production, and Creative Writing.

First Nations, Métis and Inuit Education




Alberta Education is committed to improving education outcomes for First Nations, Métis and Inuit (FNMI) students and to closing the gap in education achievement between Indigenous students and other provincial students. Students volunteer in the community and create community
